The dream weavers of Aham Bhumika

Gond Art is a tribal art from found primarily in Central India. With machine printing and digital imaging taking over the textile market, Team Aham Bhumika, Bhopal, chose to do

something different, innovative and give back value to the society. They chose to provide sustainable livelihood to 35 artisans who mastered the art in past 3 years. The Hand Embroidery Project of Aham Bhumika was born. With little brainstorming and out-of- box thinking, the traditional art which was hitherto lying unused in these people was given life. Flamboyant Gond Art designs are created by the budding artists which are woven into cushion covers, bags and other accessories by the rural women of 2 villages namely Borda and Mahabadia adjacent to each other.





The merchandize found excellent markets online and offline. The project has gained momentum and now, a significant proportion of the highly under privileged villages of Bhopal are being trained. By embedding financial sustenance in their lives, Aham Bhumika has contributed to a radical change in the quality of education and health care in these areas. Needle work of floral and geometric patterns and Gond art designs are taught to women. Aham Bhumika works for the upliftment of women mainly the destitute, widows and the under-privileged. "We have been operating this successfully for the past three years without any institutional support", says Subrat Goswami, Founder of Aham Bhumika.

The market for embroidery products of Aham Bhumika is on the rise. Zipper pouches, tote bags with hand embroidery of zodiac signs and spectacle cases have been added to the portfolio. The enterprise cashes in on social media marketing and has made
